




Pastor Jen was on vacation last week and Dave Shetler was our guest preacher. The following scripture was the topic of his message.

Luke 2:41-52 (The Message)

⁴¹⁻⁴⁵ Every year Jesus' parents traveled to Jerusalem for the Feast of Passover. When he was twelve years old, they went up as they always did for the Feast. When it was over and they left for home, the child Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents didn't know it. Thinking he was somewhere in the company of pilgrims, they journeyed for a whole day and then began looking for him among relatives and neighbors. When they didn't find him, they went back to Jerusalem looking for him.

⁴⁶⁻⁴⁸ The next day they found him in the Temple seated among the teachers, listening to them and asking questions. The teachers were all quite taken with him, impressed with the sharpness of his answers. But his parents were not impressed; they were upset and hurt.

His mother said, "Young man, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been half out of our minds looking for you."



 $^{49-50}$ He said, "Why were you looking for me? Didn't you know that I had to be here, dealing with the things of my Father?" But they had no idea what he was talking about. $^{51-52}$ So he went back to Nazareth with them, and lived obediently with them. His mother held these things dearly, deep within herself. And Jesus matured, growing up in both body and spirit, blessed by both God and people. 

Please join us for a book discussion of *White Fragility* by Robin DiAngelo led by Dawn Wojcik and Roxie Ballard.



Treasure and Give Thanks

There is a piece of art in my office that is always in my line of vision as I lift my eyes from my work. Since you can't see it, I would like for you to imagine it as I describe it here.

There are two small kitchen tables and one chair at each table. The first table is what I call the table of grace. It is overflowing with a feast of foods - fruits, vegetables, prepared meat, desserts, whatever you might envision as your ideal feast. This table is so full and piled high that if you would slightly bump it, something would fall off. Yet there is just one chair for one person to sit in.

While sitting at the table of grace, you can see a second table in your peripheral vision. This table is only about one-fourth of the way covered with garbage. It's the kind of garbage that a pet would drag into your house, something you would want to remove quickly before it starts to stink or contaminate things. You would never think of putting it on your kitchen table! There is one chair at this table of garbage, and this chair has it's back to the table of grace. The one who chooses to sit at this table will only see the garbage in front of them, accepting this as their reality.

The works of the Lord are great; they are to be desired and treasured. We have been given a table of grace at which to reside that is overflowing with the blessings of God. Sitting at this table, we can still see the darker, challenging circumstances in our life, but this is not where we reside nor what we choose to dwell on.

May today be a day to recognize and treasure the works of the Lord in your life. Give thanks. You are loved! Return to the table of grace and reside in the blessings of God, as you experience the gift of life that has been given to you in such a time as this.
